

The Gospel

Matt 25: 31-46

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Bishops Message Year of Prayer Feast of St Ephrem, The "Harp of the Holy Spirit"

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we mark the Feast Day of St. Ephrem, celebrated on January 28th, we reflect on the profound influence he had on the spiritual and liturgical life of the Maronite Church. Known as the "Harp of the Holy Spirit", St. Ephrem's life and works continue to inspire and guide our Maronite tradition.

St. Ephrem was a deacon and little is known about his life. Born around the year 306, he likely originated from the vicinity of Nisbis, then a city in Persia. Some historians infer from his writings that he came from a Christian family and was baptised as an adult. St. Ephrem, also an ascetic, had St. James of Nisbis as his spiritual father, to whom he dedicated a hymn. In about 364, he entered solitude on Mount Edessa, a practice not uncommon in Antioch and Edessa at the time. The Maronite community grew out of this commitment to asceticism and monasticism, inspired by our spiritual father, St. Maroun. St. Ephrem passed away on 9 June 373.

Writing in Syriac, St. Ephrem used hymns and powerful poetic imagery to address the heresies of his time. Recognising the power of music as an educational tool, he emphasised its role for both young and old alike. St. Ephrem also had a particular devotion to the Virgin Mary, dedicating a hymn, the Hymn on the Nativity, to her.

In the Syriac Churches, poetry and hymns serve as primary vehicles for teaching theology, a fact evident in Maronite Liturgy where a significant portion is sung by both the celebrant and the congregation. The rich imagery and poetry of the liturgy leave a lasting impression. It is so often that a Maronite child who attends Mass from a young age can be heard chanting the "Qadishat" at home. This is because hymns stay with children and they can learn from them.

Preserving Our Traditions



Ephrem's example teaches us that in our liturgy, hymns are not mere music to listen to: they are powerful praying and teaching tools integral to our Maronite tradition. Whether vou are aware or not, if you attend the Maronite Mass, you are using the words of St Ephrem. Let us live, sing, and teach these hymns children and our Masses, going beyond

passive listening to the choir during liturgy. Let the words of the hymns resonate within us, actively participating in this beautiful aspect of our Maronite faith.

I wish you a blessed feast day of St Ephrem – may his writings and compositions continue to resonate within our hearts, guiding us in faith and tradition.






