
Sunday of the Faithful Departed

The Gospel Luke 16: 19-31

'There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames." But Abraham said, "Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us." He said, "Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house for I have five brothers that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment." Abraham replied, "They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them." He said, "No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent." He said to him, "If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."

قالَ الربُّ يَسوع: «كَانَ رَجُلٌ غَنِيٌّ يَلْبَسُ الأُرْجُوانَ وَالكَتَّانَ النَّاعِمِ، وَيَتَنَعَّمُ كُلَّ يَوْمِ بِأَفْخَرِ الوَلائِمِ. وكانَ رَجُلٌ مسْكِينٌ ٱسْمُهُ لَعَازَرُ مَطْرُوحًا عِنْدَ بَابِهِ، تَكْسُوهُ القُرُوحِ. وكانَ يَشْتَهِي أَنْ يَشْبَعَ مِنَ الفُتَاتِ المُتَسَاقِطِ مِنْ مَائِدَةِ الغَنِيّ، غَيْرَ أَنَّ الكِلابَ كَانَتْ تَأْتِي فَتَلْحَسُ قُرُوحَهُ. وَمَاتَ المسْكينُ فَحَمَلَتْهُ ٱلمَلَائِكَةُ إلى حِضْن إبْرَاهِيم. ثُمَّ مَاتَ الغَنِيُّ وَدُفِن. وَرَفَعَ الغَنِيُّ عَيْنَيْه، وَهُوَ في الجَحِيمِ يُقَاسِي العَذَاب، فَرَأَى إبْرَاهِيمَ مِنْ بَعِيد، وَلَعَازَرَ في حِضْنِهِ. فَنَادَى وقَال: يا أَبَتِ إِبْرَاهِيم، إِرْحَمْنِي وَأَرْسِلْ لَعَازَرَ لِيَبُلَّ طَرَفَ إِصْبَعِهِ بِمَاءٍ وَيُبَرّدَ لِسَانِي، لأَنِّي مُتَوَجّعٌ في هذا اللَّهِيب. فَقالَ إِبْرَاهِيم: يا ٱبْنِي، تَذَكَّرْ أَنَّكَ نِلْتَ خَبْراتِكَ في حَبَاتِكَ، وَلَعَازَرُ نَالَ البَلايَا. والآنَ هُوَ يَتَعَزَّى هُنَا، وأَنْتَ تَتَوَجَّع. وَمَعَ هذَا كُلِّهِ، فَإِنَّ بَيْنَنا وَبَيْنَكُم هُوَّةً عَظِيمَةً ثَابِتَه، حَتَّى إِنَّ الَّذِينَ يُرِيدُونَ أَنْ يَجْتَازُوا مِنْ هُنا إلَيْكُم لا يَسْتَطْيعُون، ولا مِنْ هُناكَ أَنْ يَعْبُرُوا إِلَيْنا. فَقَالَ الغَنِيّ: أَسْأَلُكَ إِذًا، يا أَبَتِ، أَنْ تُرْسِلَ لَعَازَرَ إِلَى بَيْتِ أَبِي، فإنَّ لِي خَمْسَةَ إخْوة، لِيَشْهَدَ لَهُم، كَي لا يَأْتُوا هُمْ أَيْضًا إلى مَكَان العَذَابِ هذَا. فقَالَ إبْرَاهِيم: عِنْدَهُم مُوسَى وَالأَنْبِياء، فَلْبَسْمَعُوا لَهُم. فَقال: لا، يَا أَبَتِ إِبْرَاهِيم، ولكِنْ إذَا مَضَى إِلَيْهِم وَاحِدٌ مِنَ الأَمْوَاتِ يَتُوبُون. فقالَ لَهُ إِبْرَاهِيمِ: إِنْ كَانُوا لَا يَسْمَعُونَ لِمُوسَى وَالأَنْسَاءِ، فَإِنَّهُم، وَلَو قَامَ وَاحِدٌ مِنَ الأَمْوَاتِ، لَنْ يَقْتَنِعُوا!».

Bishops Message Year of Prayer Sunday of the Faithful Departed – Feast of St Maroun

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Each year on 9 February, we celebrate the Feast of our patron, St Maroun. His Feast remains for us a source of spirituality and hope. Learning about the testimony and life of our father St Maroun helps us understand our identity as Maronites and encourages us to give witness to Jesus Christ amid challenges and persecution. So our calling is to always strive to bring all to Christ, as he did.

St Maroun's world in the fourth and fifth centuries was challenging; there was little security in life, regardless of wealth and social standing. Food shortages and diseases were rampant; law and order in cities faltered, with the Roman Empire in constant conflict. This led to a population shift, with many fleeing to the countryside for peace, despite the hardships.

Maroun, a monk and priest at the time, chose to leave settled life for one of solitude, living as a hermit in the open air on a mountain top in Quorrosh - North Syria. He is known for converting a pagan temple into a Church but also pagans to Christianity.

He chose a life of celibacy and poverty, inspiring many to follow his example. He lived an ascetic life, endured all challenges and made out of his life a sacrifice to God. Like a mountain resisting a hurricane, Maroun's faith remained unshaken. And so, remaining in one place, he drew men and women who came to him seeking spiritual advice and following his way of life; poverty, chastity, prayer and meditation, and most importantly love. He was passionate about spreading the message of the Gospel and zealous about the healing of 'lost souls'.

Ultimately, and after his death in 410AD, Beit Maroun, or the "House of Maroun," was built in 452AD. Those who followed Maroun's style of life and spirituality became known as Maronites. This spiritual movement flourished and became a Church in the 7th Century, the Maronite Antiochian Church – the only Catholic Church named after a saint.

As Maronites, we strive to embody Christ's likeness, drawing on the faith, hope, and courage of St Maroun, who teaches us to serve rather than seek to be served. Our times parallel Maroun's, and urge us to deepen our faith for our mission amidst today's challenges, insecurities and uncertainties of the world.

His example holds immense value for us today but also on this Sunday's Commemoration of the Faithful Departed. In a world that can be hostile or indifferent to the truth of the Gospel, our focus must remain on building the kingdom of God here on earth, where Christ is always offering us grace, hope and consolation in the face of the darkness of this world. Let us be reminded of the eternal life that awaits us and encourages us to hold fast to our faith without wavering, like St Maroun did. Let us seek his intercession for the repose of the souls of all those who have gone before us, so they may be ushered into heaven in accordance with the promises of Christ.

On this Feast day, I invite you to participate in the Solemn Mass at St Maroun's Cathedral (Redfern) on Thursday 8 February at 7pm, the vigil of St Maroun's Feast. I extend an invitation for the interstate communities in Brisbane and Adelaide to attend the Patronal Feast celebrations on 18 February in Brisbane and the 25th in Adelaide. I also extend blessings to all carrying the name of our spiritual father and wish you all, and your families, a blessed and joyful Feast of St Maroun.

Reflection of the Week "Sunday of the Faithful Departed"

Salvation is not earnt or bought. It simply comes down to wanting what is good for others. That is the lesson of today's Gospel.

The parable of the rich man and Lazarus offers many angles. You have the wretched man who really cannot do anything to earn his way to heaven. And that's just it. Eternal life is a gift to all, and the least of us is just as welcomed as anyone else. The poor man Lazarus lived a life of poverty and suffering. We know nothing else except that God in the end gave all that is good to Lazarus.

The rich man we know lived luxuriously but ends up in misery and torment. Thus, our next lesson is that wealth cannot buy us eternal life with God.

The rich man begs for salvation, but it is too late. So, our third lesson is that our time on earth and how we live it matters as it will determine our eternal life. Our actions here matter for the good of others and our own salvation.

The rich man believes if someone comes from the dead to teach people of eternal life then they will listen. But no one can convince another, no matter how persuasive the rhetoric. So, our final lesson is this: salvation and eternal life is in the end each person's personal choice. Do I want to believe and hope for a blessed life for myself and others, or not?

In the end we need others for our own good. They keep us grounded and bring out the best in us. We are meant to walk each other into eternal life, or else we will be left alone in misery. Amen **Sr Margaret Ghosn mshf**
