

The Gospel

Luke 8: 40-56

When Jesus returned, the crowd welcomed him, for they were all waiting for him. Just then there came a man named Jairus, a leader of the synagogue. He fell at Jesus' feet and begged him to come to his house, for he had an only daughter, about twelve years old, who was dying. As he went, the crowds pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years; and though she had spent all she had on physicians, no one could cure her. She came up behind him and touched the fringe of his clothes, and immediately her haemorrhage stopped. Then Jesus asked, 'Who touched me?' When all denied it, Peter said, 'Master, the crowds surround you and press in on you.' But Jesus said, 'Someone touched me; for I noticed that power had gone out from me.' When the woman saw that she could not remain hidden, she came trembling; and falling down before him, she declared in the presence of all the people why she had touched him, and how she had been immediately healed. He said to her, 'Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace.' While he was still speaking, someone came from the leader's house to say, 'Your daughter is dead; do not trouble the teacher any longer.' When Jesus heard this, he replied, 'Do not fear. Only believe, and she will be saved.' When he came to the house, he did not allow anyone to enter with him, except Peter, John, and James, and the child's father and mother. They were all weeping and wailing for her; but he said, 'Do not weep; for she is not dead but sleeping.' And they laughed at him, knowing that she was dead. But he took her by the hand and called out, 'Child, get up!' Her spirit returned, and she got up at once. Then he directed them to give her something to eat. Her parents were astounded; but he ordered them to tell no one what had happened.

لَمَّا عَادَ يَسُوع، ٱسْتَقْبَلَهُ الجَمْع، لأَنَّهُم جَميعَهُم كَانُوا يَنْتَظِرُونَهُ. وَإِذَا بِرَجُلِ ٱسْمُهُ يَائِيرُس، وكَانَ رَئِيسَ المَجْمَع، جَاءَ فَأَرْتَمَى عَلَى قَدَمَي يَسُوع، وَأَخَذَ يَتَوَسَّلُ إِلَيْهِ أَنْ يَدْخُلَ بَيْتَهُ، لأَنَّ لَهُ ٱبْنَةً وَجِيدَة، عُمْرُها نُحُو ٱثْنتَى عَشْرَةَ سَنَة، قَدْ أَشْرَفَتْ عَلَى المَوْت. وفِيمَا هُوَ ذَاهِب، كانَ الجُمُوعُ يَرْ حَمُو نَهُ. وَكَانَتُ ٱمْرَ أَةٌ مُصِابَةٌ بِنَرْ فِ دَم مُنْذَ ٱتْتَتَى عَشْرَةَ سَنَة، وَلَمْ يَقْدِرْ أَحَدٌ أَنْ يَشْفِيهَا لَا دَنَتْ مِنْ وَرَاءِ بَسُوع، وَلَمَسَتْ طَرَفَ رِدَائِهِ، وَفَجِأَةً وَقَفَ نَزْفُ دَمِهَا. فَقَالَ يَسُوع: «مَنْ لَمَسَنِي؟». وَأَنْكَرَ الجَمِيعِ. فَقَالَ بُطْرُسُ وَمَنْ مَعَهُ: «بيا مُعَلِّم، إِنَّ الجُمُوعَ يَزْحَمُونَكَ وَيُضايِقُونَكَ! ». فَقَالَ يَسُوع: ﴿إِنَّ وَاحِدًا قَدْ لَمَسَنِي! فَإِنِّي عَرَفْتُ أَنَّ قُوَّةً قَدْ خَرَجَتُ مِنْي!». وَرَأْتِ ٱلْمَرْأَةُ أَنَّ أَمْرَها لَمْ يَخْفَ عَلَيه، فَدَنَتْ مُرْ تَعِدَةً و ٱرْ تَمَتْ عَلَى قَدَمَيه، وَ أَعْلَنَتْ أَمَامَ الشَّعْبِ كُلِّهِ لِماذَا لَمَسَتْهُ، وَكَبْفَ شُوْيَتْ لِلْحَالِ فَقَالَ لَهَا يَسُوع: «يا ٱبْنَتِي، إِيْمَانُكِ خَلُّصَكِ! إِذْهَبِي بِسَلام!». وَفَيمَا هُوَ يَتَكَلُّم، وَصَلَ وَاحِدٌ مِنْ دَارِ رَئِيسِ الْمَجْمَعِ يَقُول: ﴿مَاتَتِ ٱبْنَتُكَ! فَلا تُزْعِج المُعَلِّم!». وَسَمِعَ يَسوعُ فَأَجَابَهُ: «لا تَخَفْ! يَكُفِّي أَنْ تُؤْمِنَ فَتَحْيَا ٱبْنَتْكَ!». وَلَمَّا وَصَلَّ إلى البَيْت، لَمْ يَدَعْ أَحَدًا يَدْخُلُ مَعَهُ سِوَى بُطْرُ سَ وَيُوحَنَّا وَيَعْقُوبَ وَأَبِي الصَّبيَّةِ وأُمِّهَا. وكَانَ الجَمِيعُ يَبْكُونَ عَلَيْها وَيَقْرَعُونَ صُدُورَهُم. فَقَال: «لا تَبْكُوا! إِنَّهَا لَمْ تَمُتْ. لكِنَّهَا نَائِمَة!». فَأَخَذُوا يَضْحَكُونَ مِنْهُ لِعِلْمُهِم بِأَنَّهِا مَاتَتْ. أَمَّا هُوَ فَأَمْسَكَ بيدِها وَنَادَى قَائِلاً: ﴿ أَيَّتُهَا الصَّبيَّة، قُومِي! ». فَعَادَتْ رُوحُهَا إِلَيْهَا، وَفَجْأَةً نَهَضَتُ . ثُمَّ أَمَرَّ بِأَنْ يُطْعِمُوهَا. فَدَهِشَ أَبَوَاها، وَأَوْصِنَاهُمَا يُسُوعُ أَلاًّ بُخْبِرَ ا أَحَدًا بِمَا حَدَث.

Bishops Message Year of Prayer

Sunday of the Haemorrhaging Woman & Feast of Sts Koura and Marana, Disciples of St Maroun

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Maronite Church celebrates on 28 February the Feast of Saints Koura and Marana, the disciples of St Maroun. Like their contemporaries in the early Maronite monastic tradition, these saints embraced a life of extraordinary austerity and devotion.

In his accounts of the two saints, Theodoret of Cyrrhus paints a vivid picture of their commitment to asceticism and contemplation, which went beyond the ordinary bounds of human endurance. Choosing a small, open-air enclosure outside town, Saints Koura and Marana lived a life of seclusion amidst the elements. Their dwelling, devoid of a roof, exposed them to nature yet, they found joy in their chosen path. Marvelling at their resilience, Theodoret notes that even the heavy chains they bore as a form of penance neither deterred their spirits. Fuelled by an all-transcending and intense love for the Divine, they saw every trial and hardship as an opportunity to draw closer to their beloved Bridegroom, Jesus Christ.

The lives of Saints Koura and Marana remind us that the essence of Christian discipleship lies in our capacity to love and be loved by God. It is this love that compels us to seek heaven, and to remain faithful to the teachings of Christ. In the end, it is through love that we find both the means and the end of our journey—a journey that leads us ever closer to the heart of Christ. Like them, we are called to embrace the path of self-denial and spiritual discipline always, not just during Lent, and not out of obligation, but rather a genuine desire to be united with the One whom we love above all else.

On this Sunday of Lent, the Maronite Church reflects on the Gospel of the Haemorrhaging Woman. Through this we see the transformative power of

encountering Christ, who alone can free us from our afflictions and restore dignity. The action of the Samaritan woman underscores the ongoing process of conversion and renewal in our Christian life, fuelled by the desire for God who dwells within us.

During this Lent, let us emulate the example of the Samaritan woman who just like Saints Koura and Marana, show us that love is the essence and the driving force that propels Christian discipleship.

May we always embrace love as the foundation of our journey towards the heart of Christ. This love compels us to seek heavenly things, remain faithful to Christ's teachings, and practice self-denial and spiritual discipline. Through love, may we discover the purpose of our Christian journey but also the means to devotedly walk in the footsteps of Christ.

Reflection of the Week "Haemorrhaging Woman"

A world where God is active. In today's Gospel passage we have two miraculous accounts, one healed unknowingly but encouraged to tell the crowds, another healing anticipated by the crowds but told to keep it hidden.

God acts but sometimes what happens in our lives is only for ourselves to dwell upon. At other times God's work is something we want to proclaim from the rooftops. What is important in either case is that we do not use the grace in our lives simply for our own self publicity or for show.

God wants to heal us, but we also need to retain that sense of humility and deep appreciation. God wants to raise us up and gift us with self-confidence, as Jesus did with the haemorrhaging woman. Where there is too much of noise and self-proclamation, God reminds us that humility matters, as in the case of Jairus.

Our attitude to what happens to us in life, is essential. We can go through life bitter at our circumstances or become very demanding. God knows we want to live fully but reminds us that grace, patience and love is the path to fullness. Just like the haemorrhaging woman, may we walk through life in humility and trust that the God of tenderness will gently attend to our needs. Amen

كلمة الحياة غذاءً للنفوس

في إنجيل هذا الأحد نلاحظ أن كثيرون ساروا وراء المسيح وواحدة نالت الشفاء وذلك لأنها تقدمت بإيمان بنفس واثقة، لقد إقتربت منه في الخفاء بإنسحاق لتتلامس مع الرّب الشافي. وبحسب شريعة العهد القديم فنازفة الدم هي نجسة تُنجِّس من يتلامس معها، لكن السيد القدوس لا يتنجس منّا بل بتلامسه معنا يُشفينا ويُقدسنا. والسيد أعلن ما فعلته هذه المرأة ليعلن إيمانها فنتشبه بها وحتى لا ينخسها ضميرها لأنها نالت العطية خلسة، ولأن المسيح أعجب بإيمانها. هذه المرأة ترمز إلى عجز العالم عن شفائنا من أمراضنا، فقط المسيح يمنحنا الشفاء والسلام. كما تعلمنا هذه المرأة كيفية الإقتراب من الرب بدون "ضجة إعلامية" أمام الناس، وهذا يتوافق مع قول الرب أنضًا أنه علنا أن نصلي في مخدعنا.
