

The Gospel Mark 2: 1-12

When Jesus returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them, not even in front of the door; and he was speaking the word to them. Then some people came, bringing to him a paralysed man, carried by four of them. And when they could not bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and after having dug through it, they let down the mat on which the paralytic lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, 'Son, your sins are forgiven.' Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts, Why does this fellow speak in this way? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?' At once Jesus perceived in his spirit that they were questions discussing these among themselves; and he said to them, Why do you raise such questions in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, "Your sins are forgiven", or to say, "Stand up and take your mat and walk"? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins' he said to the paralytic 'I say to you, stand up, take your mat and go to your home.' And he stood up, and immediately took the mat and went out before all of them; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying, 'We have never seen anything like this!'

عَادَ يَسُوعُ إِلَى كَفَرْنَاحُوم. وسَمِعَ النَّاسُ أَنَّهُ في البَيْت. فتَجَمَّعَ عَدَدٌ كَبِيرٌ مِنْهُم حَتَّى غَصَّ بِهِم المَكَان، ولَمْ يَبْقَ مَوْضِعٌ لأَحَدٍ ولا عِنْدَ البَاب. وكانَ يُخَاطِبُهُم بِكَلِمَةِ الله. فأَتَوْهُ بِمُخَلَّع يَحْمِلُهُ أَرْبَعَةُ رِجَال. وبِسَبَبِ الجَمْع لَمْ يَسْتَطِيعُوا الوُصُولَ بِهِ إلى يَسُوع، فكَشَفُوا السَّقْفَ فَوْقَ يَسُوع، ونَبَشُوه، ودَلُّوا الفِرَاشَ الَّذِي كَانَ المُخَلَّعُ مَطْرُوحًا عَلَيْه. ورَأَى يَسُوعُ إِيْمَانَهُم، فقَالَ لِلْمُخَلَّع: «يَا ٱبْنى، مَعْفُورَةٌ لَكَ خطَايَاك!». وكانَ بَعْضُ الكَتَبَةِ جَالِسِينَ هُنَاكَ يُفَكِّرُونَ في قُلُوبِهم: لِمَاذَا يَتَكَلَّمُ هذَا الرَّجُلُ هكَذَا؟ إِنَّهُ يُجَدِّف! مَنْ يَقْدِرُ أَنْ يَغْفِرَ الخَطَايَا إلاَّ الله وَحْدَهُ ؟. وفي الحَالِ عَرَفَ يَسُوعُ بِرُوحِهِ أَنَّهُم يُفَكِّرُونَ هِكَذَا في أَنْفُسِهم فَقَالَ لَهُم: «لِمَاذَا تُفَكِّرُونَ بِهِذَا في قُلُوبِكُم؟ ما هُوَ الأَسْهَل؟ أَنْ يُقَالَ لِلْمُخَلَّع: مَغْفُورَةٌ لَكَ خطَايَاكَ ؟ أَمْ أَنْ يُقَال: قُمْ وَٱحْمِلْ فِرَاشَكَ وَٱمْش؟ ولِكَى تَعْلَمُوا أَنَّ لأَبْن الإنْسَان سُلْطَانًا أَنْ يَغْفِرَ الخَطَايَا عَلَى الأَرْض»، قالَ لِلْمُخَلَّعِ: لَكَ أَقُول: قُم، إِحْمِلْ فِرَاشَكَ، وٱذْهَبْ إِلَى بَيْتِكَ!. فقَامَ في الحَالِ وحَمَلَ فِرَاشَهُ، وخَرَجَ أَمامَ الجَمِيعِ، حَتَّى دَهِشُوا كُلُّهُم ومَجَّدُوا اللهَ قَائِلِين: «مَا رَأَيْنَا مِثْلَ هذَا البَتَّة!».

Bishops Message Year of Prayer Sunday of the Paralytic and Feast of the 40 Martyrs

Dear Brothers and Sisters

On the 9th of March, we honour the courage of the Forty Martyrs, the brave souls, once soldiers in a Roman legion under the leadership of Lysias the pagan, who chose to follow the path of Christ despite facing persecution and death.

Originally from Sebastia, Armenia, they refused to join the Roman army to offer sacrifices to pagan idols. Refusing to renounce their Christian beliefs, the Forty Martyrs stood firm in their conviction, even when confronted by Governor Agricola. Their refusal to participate in these rituals led to imprisonment and relentless attempts to sway them from their faith, including threats of stripping them of their military ranks. However, they remained resolute. The governor ordered them thrown into a lake with freezing water. They encouraged one another, saying, "We descend forty into the water; forty of us will ascend to heaven."

The Eastern Churches honour their memory and we strive to emulate their example of unwavering faith and sacrifice. We ask for their intercessions to face any challenges with unshakeable faith and glorify the Lord through our actions.

Sunday of the Paralytic

On this fifth Sunday of Lent, we reflect on a new kind of healing, unlike the other miraculous healings performed by Jesus: the Church bringing the suffering of one of its members to the Lord.

The Gospel tells us that the man rose, picked up his mat at once, and went away in the sight of everyone. Strange is the case of this healed man: his only action was to carry out Jesus' command, to pick up his mat and go home. He was silent, speaking only through his compliance with the Lord's will: the Lord healed him, so he thanked Him by standing before the community, carrying his mat after years of being carried on it.

Thus, the focus of this healing was not solely on the faith of the healed man but also on the community around him. The narrative begins with the community bringing the paralysed man to Jesus but ends with the the healed man bringing faith to the community who were "astounded and glorified God."

Just as the four friends carried the paralysed man to the Lord, the Church also carries us towards healing. These arms lifting us are the prayers of the saints, the prayers of the church in heaven, our prayers for one another and our own personal prayers. Our faith is not meant to be lived alone but in a community where we support one another: family, friends, colleagues, carrying one another to Christ with humility.

This week, we ask our Heavenly Father to teach us how to unite our families and communities and care for them with love. May we encourage and support one another in our faith so that anybody who looks at our church community is astounded and glorifies God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this." (Mark 2:12)

Reflection of the Week "The Paralytic"

As we enter deeper into Lent we reflect on the healing of the paralytic and what it means for us today.

Jesus does not heal the man immediately. Rather Jesus forgives the man of his sins. Only later does he heal the paralytic of his physical disability. Point to take here is that God comes to heal us holistically - emotionally, spiritually and physically.

Jesus says to him, 'stand up, take your mat and go to your home' (v11). A great deal said in a few words. Let's pull this apart.

Stand up is to reclaim your dignity, presence and selfesteem. To set off on your individual journey without dependence on others. To make your own way in the world. Take your mat is to never forget your past, your struggles, your needs. Learn from your sufferings and learn to accept whatever has happened.

Go to your home is to be restored to fullness of life. It is to return to relationships and love and belonging because all of this is essential for your growth.

So, during this Lenten journey let us take heart that no matter our current burdens and hardships, we can still move forward and achieve a sense of deeper purpose. Amen **Sr Margaret Ghosn mshf**
