Bishops Message **Year of Prayer** 8th Sunday of Pentecost Feast of the Massabki Brothers



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On Wednesday 10 July, our Maronite Church celebrates the Feast of the Massabki brothers, Francis, Abdel Moati, and Raphael. These Maronite martyrs were slain in Damascus in 1860 during a period of intense anti-Christian uprising in Syria and Lebanon during the Ottoman rule. It is estimated that some 12,000 Christians were slain in Lebanon, and 11,000 in Syria.

The Massabki brothers came from a prominent and wealthy Syrian family, known for their piety, generosity, and commitment to aiding the poor and needy. Francis, a successful silk trader, was well-known across Lebanon and Syria, even representing the Maronite Patriarch on some occasions in Syria. Abdel Moati and Raphael, each remarkable in their own right, shared a deep devotion to prayer and charitable works, much of which they carried out from the Franciscan monastery in Damascus.

In 1860, as violence swept through Damascus and other parts of Lebanon, the brothers sought refuge in the Franciscan monastery, where they prayed and celebrated the Mysteries of Reconciliation and the Eucharist for the last time. Their steadfast faith was put to the ultimate test when armed men stormed the Monastery and demanded they renounce their Christian faith.

While Francis was alone in the Church, kneeling and praying before the statue of Our Lady of Sorrows, he was seized and told: "Sheikh Abdallah has sent us to save you from death; you, your brothers, your families, and all those who depend upon you for protection, on the condition that you deny your faith and convert to Islam." Francis courageously replied: "Sheikh Abdallah can take the money I lent him, he can also take my life; but my faith, no one can make me deny. I am a Maronite Christian and in the faith of Christ I will die. As our Lord Jesus commanded, we do not fear those who can kill the body." As Francis began to pray, they massacred him. It is believed that he had lent the sheikh eight hundred thousand pounds, which was a vast fortune in those days.

Abdel Moati was seized at the chapel door and told to deny his faith in order to save his life. In a clear voice, he said: "I am a Christian, kill me, I am ready." Raphael was found and given the same order—convert or die. He fell to his knees in prayer. Each brother, with unwavering courage, chose martyrdom over denying their faith, thus sealing their eternal legacy as true servants of Christ. They were later buried with the Franciscan priests who had also been martyred.

On 10 July 1860, His Holiness Pope Pius IX declared them Venerable, and on 10 October 1926, they were beatified. In wonderful news announced last week, after approval by Pope Francis, the three Blessed Massabki brothers, Abdel Moati, Francis, and Raphael, will be canonised on Sunday 20 October 2024 in the Vatican. This canonisation, which will take place at the same time as that of eight Franciscan Friars who were martyred on the same night, is a tremendous blessing for our Church.

Their elevation to sainthood is not only a recognition of their steadfast faith and ultimate sacrifice but also a beacon of inspiration for our Maronite community and the wider Christian faithful. As we look forward to the canonisation of the Massabki brothers and the beatification of Patriarch Estephan El Douaihy on 2 August, let us continue to pray for more holy individuals within our Church and families. May the Lord be glorified through His saints, and may their intercession strengthen our faith and resolve.

Reflection of the Week: "Gently"


The calmness in which Jesus went about his day is something that draws people to him. He was like all of us, pulled and challenged in every direction, and yet he always maintained his inner peace.

In today's Gospel we read that the Pharisees conspired to destroy him (v14) and that crowds followed him (v15). It was not an easy life he led. Jesus was constantly questioned about his words and actions. He was at the same time always in demand and giving of himself constantly. Yet what is amazing is that he never yielded to hate, fear or anger. Jesus was ready and open to giving himself deeply, time and time again. It is something we can all learn from him. This ability to be at deep peace with oneself stems from a relationship and knowledge much deeper than anything else - the intimate presence of a loving God in our lives.

Jesus is described as 'will not break a bruised reed or quench a smouldering wick' (v20). The essence of Jesus' charism was his ability to empathise with those who were struggling. He offered love, patience and hope. This is real strength – to deeply know the other and care for them.

Jesus has purpose in life. He knows what he wants to do and what he must do. He embraces life wholly and lovingly. Jesus is love. We are drawn to him and called outwards as people of love. Amen




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
