The Gospel

Luke 18: 9-14

Jesus also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: 'Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the a tax-collector. The other Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, "God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax-collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income." But the tax-collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!" I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who themselves will exalt humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted.'

Bishops Message

Year of Prayer

16th Sunday of Pentecost – Father's Day



Dear Brothers and Sisters, This Sunday, as we gather to celebrate Father's Day in Australia, we honour the dads in our families but also those who embrace the role of fathers, in all its forms.

As I reflect on this special

day, my thoughts turn to my own father, who, like many of the fathers in our community, remains in Lebanon. Although separated by distance, his words and influence on my life remain ever-present. I am blessed with a wonderful father, patient and holy, a man of few words but rich in action. Until the age of 12, I grew up in a home where he was my provider, my support, and my refuge.

At 12, I joined the school of the pre-novitiate of the Lebanese Maronite Order at Our Lady of Tamish. Though I deeply missed my father, I was blessed to be surrounded by men—monks and priests—who embraced a different fatherhood role with loyalty and devotion. These spiritual fathers guided me from my early formation through the novitiate, seminary, and priesthood. They looked after my well-being, also guiding me on my spiritual journey. Many of them have since passed into eternal life, and today, I remember them and pray they are in the company of our Lord and His saints.

Fatherhood takes on many forms. Fathers in our families provide for their children, offering love, security, and guidance. Spiritual fathers, such as our priests, dedicate their lives to nurturing souls and guiding us towards a relationship with God. Many men in our community take on fatherly roles as mentors, leaders and teachers, inspiring others with their example, service and kindness.

Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde*, reflects on the fatherhood of Saint Joseph, reminding us that parenthood is not solely biological but deeply spiritual. He writes, "In his relationship to Jesus, Joseph was the earthly shadow of the heavenly Father... Fathers are not born but made. A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child. Whenever a man accepts responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person."

In the same way, true fatherhood shadows God's love in the heart of our families. It is not about authority or control, but about guiding the family members with love and care towards heaven.

On this Father's Day, let us offer our prayers and gratitude for all the fathers and father figures in our lives and I ask you, in a particular way, to pray for our priests. We also remember the fathers who have passed into eternal life and those men who long to become fathers, that they may soon be blessed with children. May all fathers continue to be a source of strength and love, drawing us closer to our Heavenly Father, the ultimate model of perfect fatherhood. Wishing you all a blessed and happy Father's Day.

Reflection of the Week "True Prayer"

Our Sunday's Gospel passage is the Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax-collector. It's a story about how we see and conduct ourselves. It also questions how we pray.

The Pharisee stands by himself when he goes to pray in the Temple. This first action sets the scene for us. Prayer is personal, yes, but it is also communal, particularly in a public place of worship such as the Temple. Thus, to choose to stand by himself suggests one who is above others, and this is further reflected in the Pharisee's words, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people' (v11). But yes, you are! We are all human, with our virtues and vices. Some may lead more virtuous lives than others, but it is only through God's grace. If we are in a better position, it is to be used to help others, not lord it over them.

The Pharisee fasts twice a week and gives a tenth of all his income. He goes above and beyond in his religious practices. Yet it all means nothing if it is to earn brownie points with God. What we do should be done with love and humility. It should not to be used to puff ourselves up.

The tax-collector on the other hand stands far off. Again, there is the invitation here to come forward. We need others, we need the prayer of the congregation. The Temple (Church) should never make one feel like an outsider.

The tax-collector asks for mercy. That alone is his entire prayer, and it reflects a depth in prayer. We all need mercy for we all fall short. But in praying for mercy, we too need to be open to forgiveness, accepting the grace of God and transforming our lives for the better. Otherwise, our practice in humility is really a show before others.

Prayer is to be honest with ourselves before God, to know our failings but also to embrace grace and live greater lives.
