Bishops Message

Year of Prayer

17th Sunday of Pentecost – The Birth of Mary Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday, 8 September, we celebrate the Feast of the Nativity of the Virgin Mary, the mother of Jesus Christ. This ancient feast, observed early in Constantinople and Jerusalem, was formalised in Rome in the 7th century.

Though the evangelists do not specify where Mary was born, tradition suggests that she may have been originally from Jerusalem. It is believed that the house of her parents, Joachim and Ann, was located there, and it is where Mary would have been born. Nearby, a church was dedicated to Mary, which later became known as the Church of St Ann. The dedication of this church was celebrated on 8 September. This feast spread to Constantinople in the 5th century and later to the West, eventually being complemented by the feast of Mary's Immaculate Conception, celebrated nine months earlier on 8 December. Theologically, Mary's birth is seen as a prelude to the great gift of salvation brought by her Son, Jesus Christ. Mary's birth was a joyful introduction to the divine plan for humanity's redemption. The feast is not only a celebration of Mary's birth but also a recognition of her role in the mystery of Christ and the Church.

Today, we honour the birth of the holiest of human creatures, uniquely loved by the Lord. Mary, the New Eve, saved by her Son, wholly dedicated to the Lord, and now glorified, has become not only the model for all believers and the image of the Church but also the mother of every disciple of her Son, Jesus. We rejoice in having such a mother and give thanks to God.

Safeguarding Sunday

This year, the Australian Catholic Church marks Child Protection Week from Monday 1 September to Sunday 8 September, with this Sunday designated as Safeguarding Sunday. The theme for this year is "Every Conversation Matters."

On this day, we reaffirm that the Maronite Eparchy of Australia, along with its parishes and affiliated organisations, is committed to the safety and wellbeing of all people, especially minors and the vulnerable. This commitment will be the primary focus of our care and decision-making. We uphold a zero-tolerance policy for the abuse, neglect, and marginalisation of minors and the vulnerable, and we are dedicated to providing a safe environment where they are protected and feel secure.

We ask our Holy Mother to grant comfort to all who are wounded in life, especially the victims of all forms of abuse and their families. The Birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary 8th September

The Catholic Church celebrates today the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of September 8, nine months after the December 8 celebration of her Immaculate



Conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne.

The circumstances of the Virgin Mary's infancy and early life are not directly recorded in the Bible, but other documents and traditions describing the circumstances of her birth are cited by some of the earliest Christian writers from the first centuries of the Church.

These accounts, although not considered authoritative in the same manner as the Bible, outline some of the Church's traditional beliefs about the birth of Mary.

The "Protoevangelium of James," which was probably put into its final written form in the early second century, describes Mary's father Joachim as a wealthy member of one of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. Joachim was deeply grieved, along with his wife Anne, by their childlessness. "He called to mind Abraham," the early Christian writing says, "that in the last day God gave him a son Isaac."

Joachim and Anne began to devote themselves extensively and rigorously to prayer and fasting, initially wondering whether their inability to conceive a child might signify God's displeasure with them.

Saint Augustine described the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary as an event of cosmic and historic significance, and an appropriate prelude to the birth of Jesus Christ. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley," he said.


Safeguarding Sunday 8 September 2024: "Every Conversation Matters"
